## DESIGN FOR VASE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9.769, dated February 27, 1877; application filed November 29, 1876.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM TWEEDDALE, of Brooklyn, Kings county, and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Vase, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

A represents the top of the flange of the bowl, which is ornamented with the raised figures b, with surrounding plain surfaced and oval-pointed sections c, between which are the points d. The upper portion of the outside of the bowl of the vase is ornamented with the vertical projecting oval ribs e, surrounded by the plain raised bands f, with the pendent pointed ribs g between said bands. The lower portion of the exterior of the vase is ornamented with the raised leaf-shaped figures h and the raised figures i. The top of the pedestal is ornamented with the raised centers  $j_1$ raised surrounding rings or bands k, the intermediate raised ribs l, and the scroll-figures m n. The body of the standard expands in concavo-conical form each way from the middle or thereabout to its junctions with the base and the bowl, respectively, has vertical flutes or grooves o, with plain intervening spaces p, and near the middle has the ornamental boss  $q_i$  with the raised ornamental figures r on its sides. The base is ornamented with the raised figures t on the oval or convex section, between the upper plain ring u and the lower convex ring w, and with the beaded ring x on the margin below the ring w.

The handles consist of the scroll B and the pendant D, which have scroll-ornaments a', b', and c', center star-shaped figure d', boss e', and the figures f' and g'.

What I claim as my invention is-

1. In a design for a vase, the upper portion of the outside of the bowl, ornamented with the vertical projecting oval ribs e, surrounded by the plain raised bands f, and the pendent pointed ribs g, between said bands, substantially as described and shown.

2. The lower portion of the exterior of the bowl, ornamented with the raised leaf-shaped figures h and the raised figures i, as

described and shown.

3. The top of the pedestal, ornamented with the raised centers j, the surrounding rings or bands k, intermediate raised ribs l, and the scroll-figures m and n, as described and shown.

- 4. The base, ornamented with the raised figures t on the oval or convex section, below the upper plan ring u and the lower convex ring w, and with the beaded ring x on the margin below the ring w, as described and shown.
- 5. The handles, ornamented with the screw B, pendants D, scroll figures a', b', and c', center star-shaped figures d', boss e', and the figures f' and g', as described and shown.
