DESIGN FOR A FONT OF PRINTING-TYPES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,811, dated March 6, 1877; application filed February 12, 1877.
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JULIUS HERRIET, of the city and county of New York, and State of New York, have originated and designed a new Design or Pattern for a Font of Printing-Types, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is clearly shown in the accompanying typographic impression, to which reference is made, and consists of lower-case and capital letters, points, and figures.

The whole design is supplementary to that for which Letters Patent No. 4,990, dated June 13, 1871, were granted to me, and differs from it in being italicized or leaning toward the right; in the absence of the serifs at the bottom of the lower-case *f h k m*, and others; the lengthening of the lower-case *f* below the

line; the absence from some of the characters—such as the lower-case *b d g*, and others—of the hair-line terminating in a dot or disk in the center of their rounded portions; the loops in the center of the capital B and R; the broken connection at the bottom of the capital B, and the addition thereto of the curving line ending in the dot or disk, besides many minor differences incidental to converting any character from a Roman or upright one into an Italic or slanting one.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a font of printing-types shown and described.
