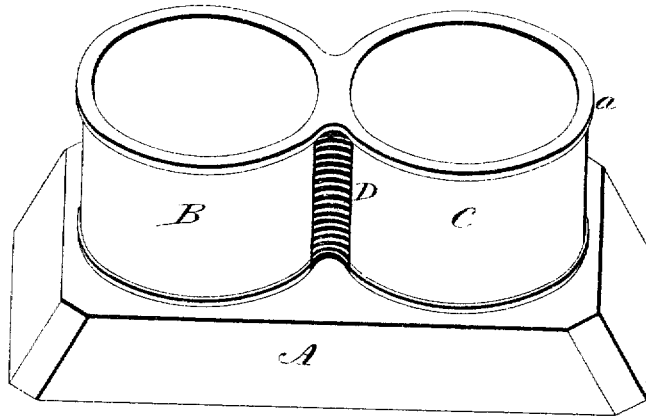

DESIGN FOR MATCH-HOLDERS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,822**, dated March 6, 1877; application filed February 20, 1877.
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM W. LYMAN, of West Meriden, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Match-Holder; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a perspective view.

This invention relates to a design for match-holders designed especially to be made in glass; and it consists in a base and two cylinders resting thereon, of the form shown in the accompanying illustration.

The base A is in the form of a frustum of a pyramid, the angles slightly cut. On the up-

per surface of this base two cylinders, B and C, are set close to each other, and connected by a vertical serrated surface, D. The upper edge of the cylinders is finished by a bead, a.

The surface of the base and of the cylinders may be ornamented in any desirable manner; but this ornamentation constitutes no part of the design, that being limited to the configuration of the parts, as before specified.

I claim—

The design for match-holder, consisting of the base A, the two cylinders B C, with the serrated connection D between the two, as shown in the accompanying illustration.
