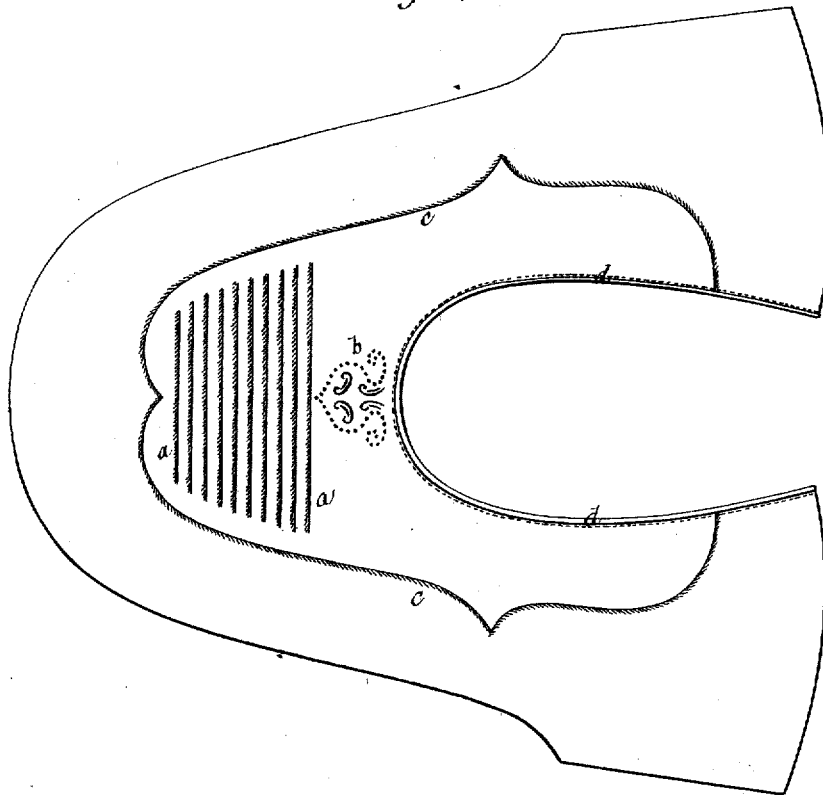
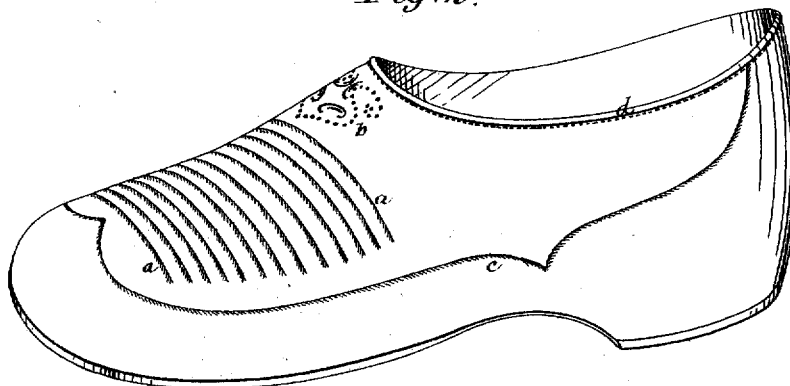

DESIGN FOR RUBBER SHOES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,847, dated March 6, 1877; application filed January 31, 1877.
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN A. OLMSTEAD, of Richmond county, New York, have invented a new and original Design for India-Rubber Boots and Shoes, of which the following is a specification:

This design relates to the ornamentation of the uppers of india-rubber boots and shoes. It is shown in the accompanying drawing, in which—

Figure 1 represents the design as it appears on a flat or spread-out upper. Fig. 2 represents a rubber overshoe ornamented with my design.

The design consists of a series of parallel ribs, *a*, resembling cords, a scroll ornament,

b, and a circumscribing cord or raised line, *c*, extending back to near the heel of the shoe, and joining a rib, *d*, which surrounds the opening in the shoe.

What I claim is—

The design for india-rubber boots and shoes herein described, and shown in the accompanying drawing.
