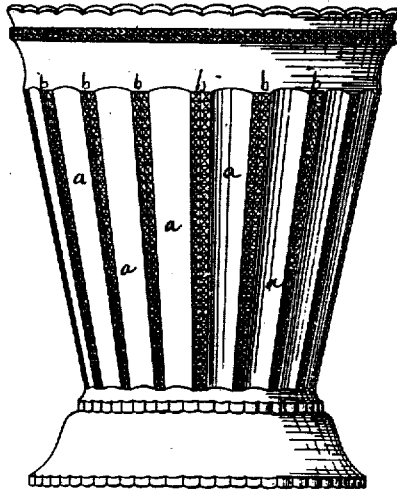

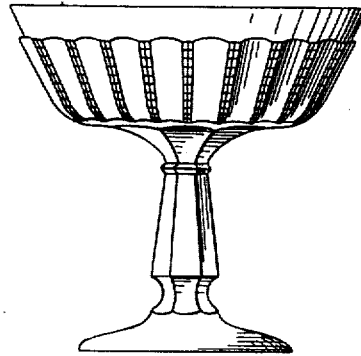

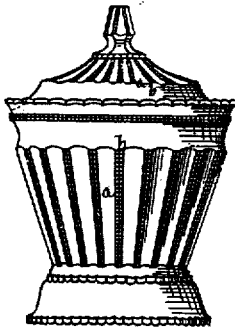

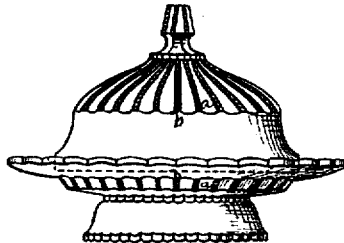

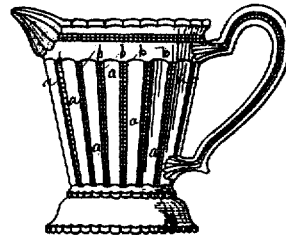

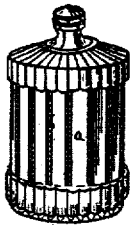

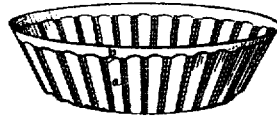
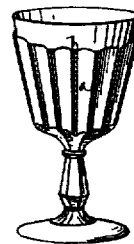

DESIGN FOR GLASSWARE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,848, dated March 13, 1877; application filed February 19, 1877.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, DAVID BARKER, of Pittsburg, Allegheny county, Pennsylvania, have invented a certain new and original Design for Glassware, of which the following is a specification:

My invention is shown in the accompanying drawing.

The general configuration of the several pieces of the set need not be described. The particular ornamentation common to all the pieces, and characteristic of my design, consists of a series of vertical or up-and-down flutes or rounded depressions, *a*, the ridges or raised parts *b* between them being ornamented by small cross-ribs or projections, as fully shown.

Some of the pieces—as, for instance, the celery or spoon glass, Figure 1, the sugar-bowl, Fig. 3, and the milk-pitcher, Fig. 5—have, in addition, a scalloped upper edge, with an annular horizontal ridge below the same, which is ornamented similarly to the vertical ridges.

What I claim is—

The design for glassware, of the configuration and ornamentation set forth.
