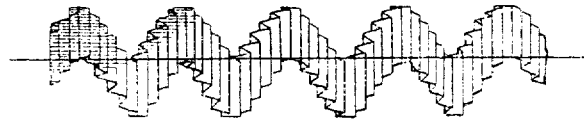

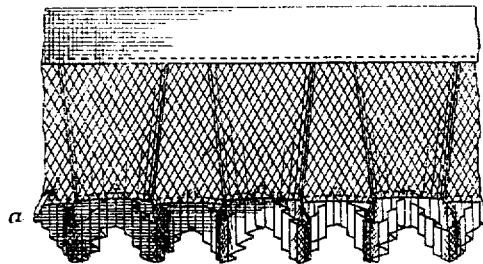
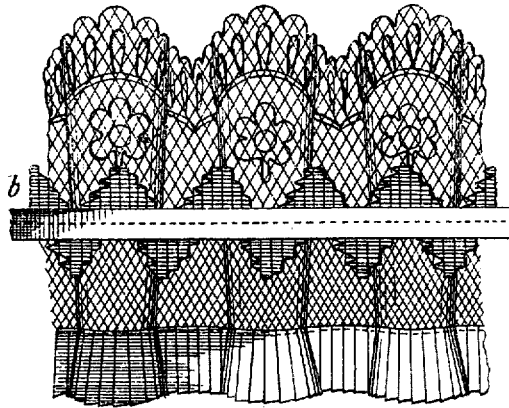

DESIGN FOR TRIMMING.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,855**, dated March 13, 1877; application filed January 27, 1877.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, AUGUST STURM, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a certain new and useful and original Design for Trimming, of which the following is a specification:

In order to produce the trimming in accordance with the design which I have invented, I take a straight strip of goods, such as crape, tarletan, or other light material. This strip I plait, and then give the strip an undulating form from end to end, it being held in this form by being attached by size to a straight string or thread. This completes the trimming, (shown in Fig. 1,) which can be used in many connections, either alone or incorpo-

rated into other articles. It may be used, for instance, as a heading for ruffling, as indicated in Fig. 2 at *a*; or it may be used in "colarets," as shown at *b*, Fig. 3.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for trimming herein described, and shown in Fig. 1 of the accompanying drawing, consisting of a strip of goods plaited and undulated, as set forth.
