

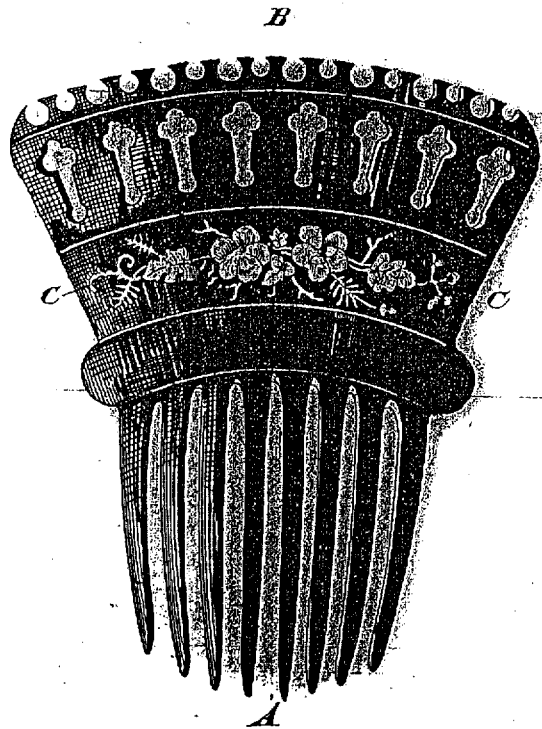

DESIGN FOR A HEAD-COMB.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,862, dated March 20, 1877; application filed March
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, PAUL J. CULLINAN, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Head-Comb, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully shown in the accompanying illustration, to which reference is made herewith.

The object of my invention is to improve the appearance of ladies' head-combs, by ornamenting the top, or a panel of the same, in a design painted or otherwise affixed thereon.

Referring to the drawing, A represents a ladies' head-comb, of any suitable material, which is provided either with a plain or an ornamentally broken-out top or crown part, B. The top B is provided with a design or ornament, C, which is painted in colors, or otherwise affixed thereto, and either extended over the entire plain top, or merely over a panel of

the same, below the part broken out, as shown in the drawing.

The design, especially when in light colors imparts an elegant and attractive appearance to the head-comb, as it relieves the somewhat dull or monotonous colors of the same, and gives them a brighter and more pleasing character.

What I claim is—

1. The design for a head-comb, having ornamentation C, as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
2. The design for a head-comb, consisting of the broken-out crown part B and the ornamentation C below the same, as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
