

DESIGN FOR BURIAL-CASKETS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,864, dated March 20, 1877; application filed March 10, 1877.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALBERT H. NIRDLINGER, of the city of Rochester, in the county of Monroe and State of New York, have invented or produced a new and original Design for Burial-Caskets; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, in which—

Figure 1 is a perspective view of a burialcasket, showing my new design. Fig. 2 is a view of the ornamental surface of the casket

on an enlarged scale.

My design relates to the exterior of the casket and the lid; and consists of an ornamental surface representing tufted work, as hereinafter described.

A is the body of the casket. B is the lid. C C C is the ornamental surface representing

tufted work. It is represented in panels covering the sides of the casket and lid, being of any suitable form. The tufted work is shown in squares, with buttons or tassels at the angles.

This tufted surface presents a flue appearance, and obviates the monotony and same-

ness of a plain surface.

What I claim herein as new is-

The design for a casket, consisting of the representation of a tufted surface for the casket and lid, as shown and described.
