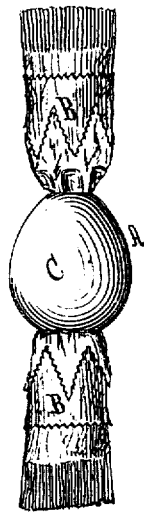

DESIGN FOR BALL-ROOM FAVORS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,868, dated March 27, 1877; application filed February 7, 1877.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MARTIN KEPPLER, of the city, county, and State of New York, have originated a Design for Favors for Ball-Rooms, &c., of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification, which drawing represents a side view.

This design consists in the combination of an egg-shaped body, with the ordinary fringed ends of a ball-room favor, said egg-shaped body being situated between the ends, and serving to impart to the article a novel and ornamental appearance.

In the drawing, the letter A designates a costume-motto, with the fringed ends B B of which is combined an egg-shaped body, C, which is situated between said ends, as shown.

By this combination a costume motto of novel and distinguishing appearance is produced.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for ball-room favors, consisting of the combination of an egg-shaped body, C, with the fringed ends B B, as shown and described.
