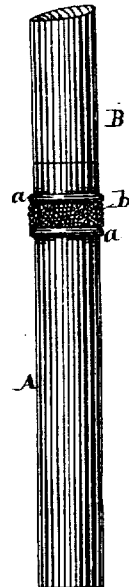
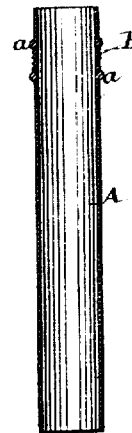

DESIGN FOR PEN AND PENCIL HOLDERS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,870**, dated March 27, 1877; application filed March 1, 1877.
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, PHILIP SCHRAG, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new Design for Pen and Pencil Holders, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification, in which drawing—

Figure 1 represents a side view. Fig. 2 is a longitudinal central section.

Similar letters indicate corresponding parts.

This design consists in two beads with an intervening granulated band.

In the drawing, the letter A designates a tube which forms a portion of a pen or pencil holder, B. This tube is ornamented by two

beads, *a a*, and an intervening band, *b*, whereby a novel and ornamental appearance is imparted to my holder.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a pen and pencil holder composed of two beads, *a a*, and an intervening granulated band, *b*, as shown and described.
