

DESIGN FOR CASSIMERES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,895, dated April 10, 1877; application filed March 31, 1877.

[Term of Patent 34 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, THOMAS HOLMES, designer and agent, of the city of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented a certain new Design for Cassimeres; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable others skilled in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying photograph, and to the letters of reference marked thereon, which form a part of this specification.

The letter A, as shown on accompanying photograph, represents narrow stripes, which are arranged in groups of three, striping the cassimeres lengthwise or warpwise, and hav-

ing a distance between each group, and thus forming a wide stripe, B, which has a double diagonal weave, showing warp and filling in any colors desired. Between the three stripes of each group there are two narrow stripes, C, formed, showing warp and filling similar to the wide stripe B.

I claim as my invention-
