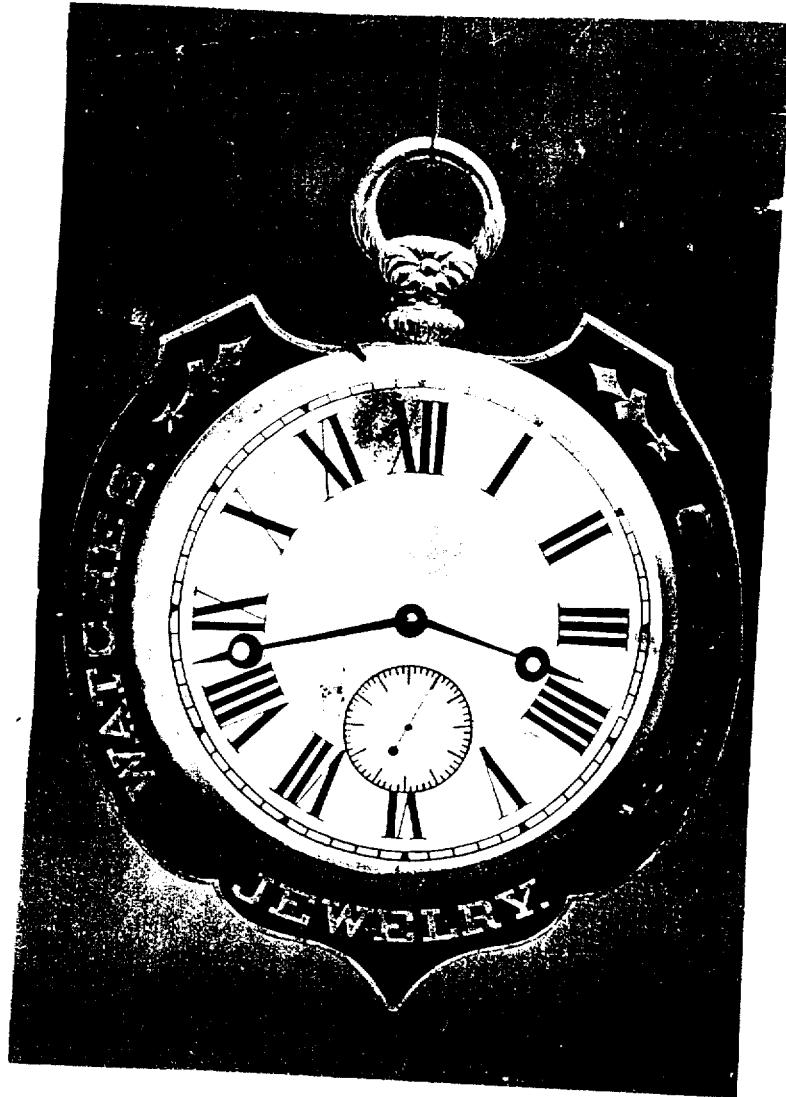

DESIGN FOR SIGNS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,897, dated April 10, 1877; application filed March 6, 1877.
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALGERNON D. SMITH, of Cincinnati, Hamilton county, Ohio, have invented or produced a new and original Design for Pendent Signs for the use of venders of clocks, watches, and jewelry, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

A represents a flat plate or slab, preferably in the form of a heraldic shield.

Each side of this slab has a boss or swell, B, in the semblance of a watch, the top of the watch being brought flush, or nearly flush, with that of the shield.

C is a pendant in imitation of that of a watch.

That part of the slab A which extends outside of the boss B constitutes a fringe or border, with the represented ornamental contour.

I claim—

The design for a watch-maker's sign, consisting of the semblance of a watch, B C, encircled by a fringe, A, in form of a heraldic shield, substantially as herein illustrated.
