DESIGN FOR A BASS-RELIEF.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,917, dated April 17, 1877; application filed December 16, 1876.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE BECK, of the town of Highland, and county of Sullivan and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design in Bass-Relief, representing Pius IX.; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and correct description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying photograph, and to the letters of reference marked thereon.

The nature of my invention consists in a new and original design of Pope Pius IX. in bass-relief.

To enable others skilled in the art to which it pertains to make and use my invention, I will proceed to describe the same.

Figure 1 represents a bust of Pius IX. on a medallion in bass-relief, clothed in clerical dress, with skull-cap on his head, and ornamented and decorated regalia around the shoulders and bust, as shown at A, Fig. 1. On the upper part of the medallion, near the

top, is the name "Pius IX." Near the outer edge of the medallion, and nearly around the sides and bottom, are the words "In Commemoration of the Œcumenical Council of MDCCCLXIX-LXX," as shown at B, Fig. 1. The size of the medallion is nine and one-quarter inches by seven inches; the head and bust six and one-half inches by three and one-half inches. This medallion is designed to be made of composition, plaster, and metals, and can also be printed, lithographed, or photographed.

What I claim as new therein, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a bass-relief, consisting of the bust representation of Pope Pius IX. in profile, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying drawing.
