## DESIGN FOR A BADGE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,918, dated April 17, 1877; application filed March 6, 1877.

[Term of Patent 34 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES McCoy, of the city of Ypsilanti, in the county of Washtenaw and State of Michigan, have invented a Design for Reform Club Badges, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which refer-

ence is made.

A represents a shield, and B a heart. The shield will be ornamented with a plain raised line round the margin, and embossed or frosted between the line and heart. The groundwork of the heart will be plain, ornamented with the motto "Dare to do right" in raised letters, properly arranged.

I am aware that the form of the shield and heart is not new, and I do not claim it.

The distinctive character of my design is found in the combination of the shield, heart, and motto, which allegorically represents the organization. The shield is emblematic of the organization as shield against intemperance. The heart is emblematic of a pure heart, which can dare to do right.

What I claim as my invention is-

The design for a badge consisting of the shield A and heart B, ornamented, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying drawing.
