

DESIGN FOR WOVEN BORDERS FOR THE ENDS OF TOWELS, &c.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,947, dated April 24, 1877; application filed April 14, 1877.

[Term of Patent 34 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, RICHARD THOMAS WEBB, of Randallstown, county of Antrim, Ireland, have invented and produced a new and original Design or Pattern for Woven Borders for the Ends of Towels or other Articles, which design or pattern has not heretofore been known or used; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full and clear description of the same.

The accompanying drawing tully represents

the nature of my design.

This design consists of a central figure, A, having on each side a narrow raised checkered line, B, outside of which are plain spaces C, bordered by the outer lines or figures D D, resembling in style the central figure A, all of which are formed by the interweaving of the different strands.

The different figures may be formed in white, or some of the strands may be colored, if desired.

The design is formed in the towel or other article near the end or edge, and may be placed on any pattern or style of towel, in any color to suit the taste.

What I claim as my invention or production,

and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—
The within-described design or pattern for woven border, composed of the central figure A, and the surrounding lines or figures B C and spaces D, all formed and combined together, with relation to each other, substantially as shown and described.
