

DESIGN FOR FANCY CASSIMERES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,951, dated May 1, 1877; application filed April 13, 1877. [Term of Patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, THOMAS HOLMES, designer, of the city of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Designs in Fancy Cassimeres; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable otherss killed in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon, which form a part of this specification.

The design is shown by accompanying photograph, of which the following is a description:

A represents a narrow stripe, running warpwise, and thus striping the pattern length. wise. B represents a wide stripe, formed by a double diagonal weave, showing warp and weft in any colors desired. C represents a narrower stripe of same weave and colors as B.
