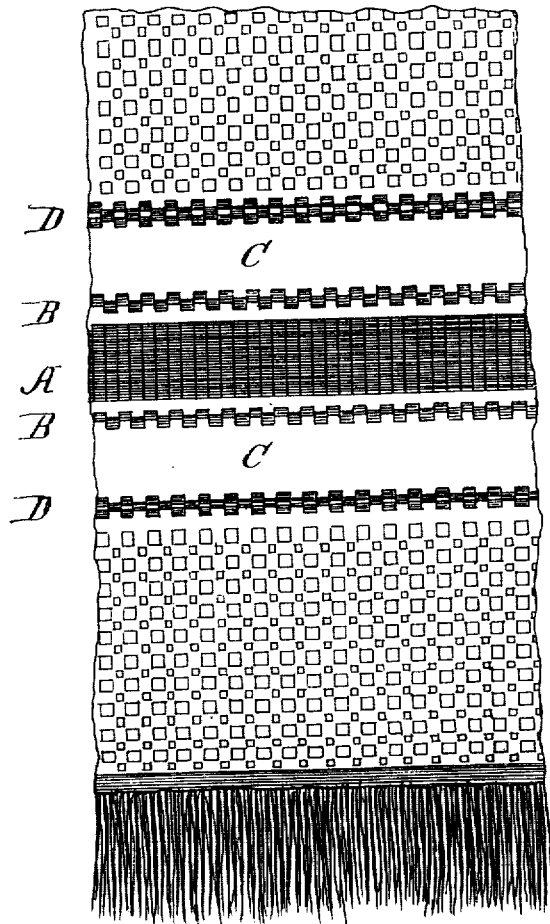

DESIGN FOR WOVEN BORDERS FOR THE ENDS OF TOWELS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,954, dated May 1, 1877; application filed April 11, 1877.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, RICHARD THOMAS WEBB, of Randallstown, county Antrim, Ireland, have invented and produced a new and original Design or Pattern for Woven Borders for the Ends of Towels or other articles, which design or pattern has not heretofore been known or used; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full and clear description of the same.

The accompanying drawing of towel fully represents the nature of my design.

The design consists of the plain central figure A, of raised heavy strands, having a checkered edge or border, B B, formed of heavy strands, and the intermediate plain space C C, on the outer edge of which are the raised checkered lines or figures D D, all of which may be formed in white by the raised heavy strands, or any portion may be colored

by the use of different colored strands or threads.

This pattern is designed to be used as a border-line at or near the ends or edges of towels, or any other articles, the body or plain portion of which may be of any desired style or pattern.

What I claim as my invention or production, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The within-described design or pattern for woven border, composed of the figures or lines A, B, C, and D, all formed and combined together in the relative positions to each other shown and described.
