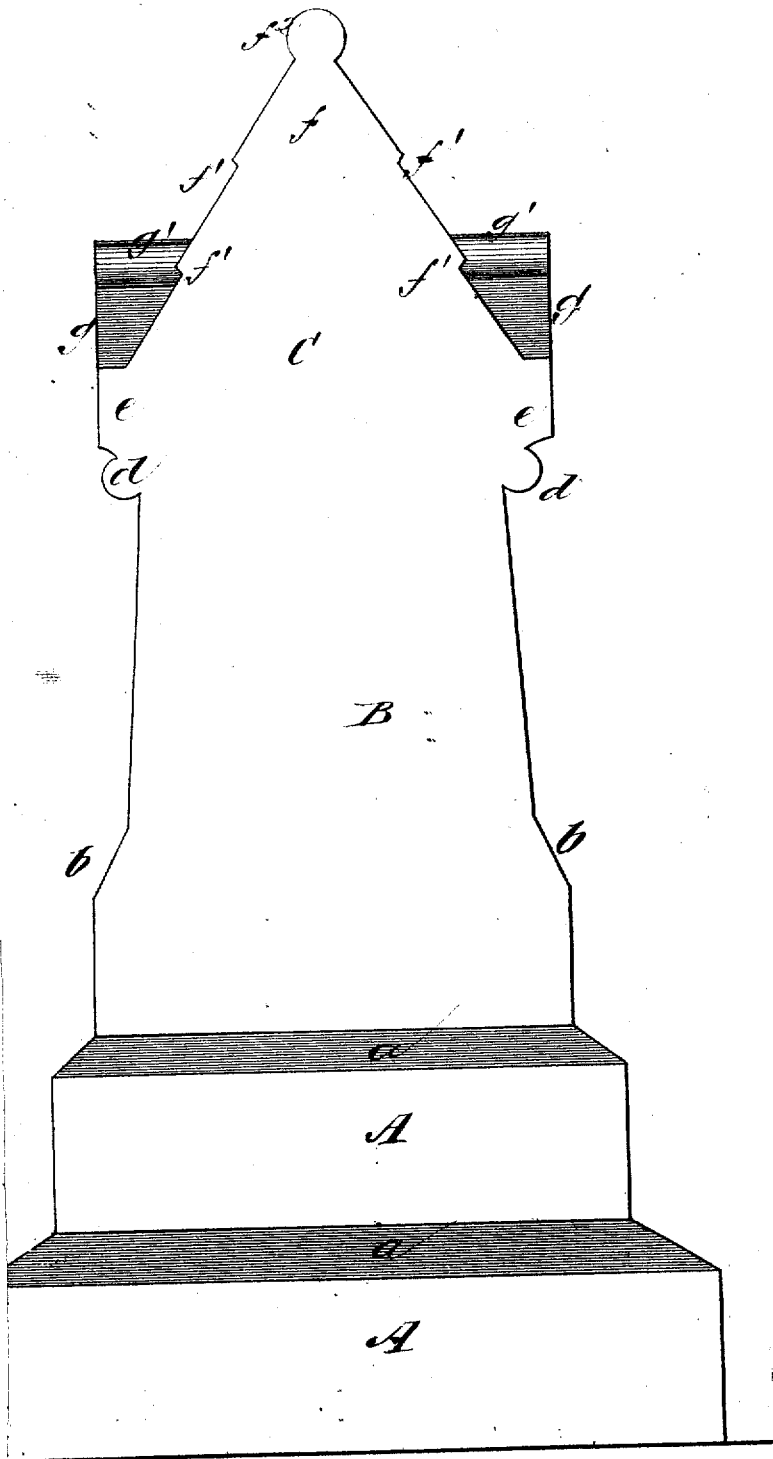
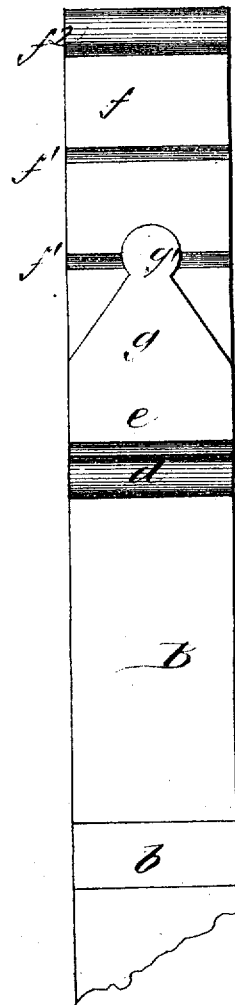

## DESIGN FOR A MONUMENT.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,961, dated May 8, 1877; application filed April 27, 1877.  
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, JAMES MORGAN, of Brooklyn, Kings county, New York, have invented a Design for a Monument, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully shown in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made, and in which—

Figure 1 is a front elevation, and Fig. 2 a side elevation.

This invention is intended for a plain style of grave-monument; and consists of base-steps, a middle section diminishing in width, and of an enlarged top with tapering ridge, and side ridges of less height.

In the drawing, A are base stones or steps, connected by intermediate tapering portions *a*; and B is the middle section, which has a lower square part and an upper part of tapering shape, the square lower, and tapering upper, parts being connected by inclined sides *b*.

The middle section B is crowned by a top, C, projecting, by round side moldings *d* and square portions *e*, from the middle section, and

having a tapering ridge, *f*, with side steps *f*<sup>1</sup> and round arm-piece *f*<sup>2</sup>. At both sides of the tapering ridge *f* are ridges *g*, of less height, having a round crown-piece, as shown clearly in Figs. 1 and 2.

Having thus described my invention, I claim—

1. The design for a monument, consisting of base of steps with tapering intermediate parts, of a middle section with upper diminishing part, and of a top with side-projecting parts, high center ridge, and side ridges of less height, substantially as shown and described.

2. The design for a top part of a monument, composed of a square base portion with a high center ridge and round crown piece, and side-projecting ridges of less height, having round crown-pieces, substantially as shown and described.
