JAMES MORGAN, OF BROOKLYN, NEW YORK.

DESIGN FOR A MONUMENT.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9.967, dated May 8, 1877; application filed April 27, 1877.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES MORGAN, of Brooklyn, county of Kings, and State of New York, have invented a Design for a Monument, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully shown in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

The design refers to a monument for graves; and consists of a base, a column, and surmounting vase, as will be more fully described.

In the drawing, A represents the base of the monument, which consists of base-steps a and b, of diminishing size, with intermediate tapering parts a' b', of a tapering middle or trunk section, d, with enlarged molding, and top part e, supporting the base of the column B. The base f consists of a pyramidally-shaped base-step, f^1 , a convex molding, f^2 , a concave molding, f^3 , and a raised band, f^4 .

The shaft of the column rises from the base f with the usual degree of taper, the capital g extending, by a raised top band, g^1 , and molding g^3 , from the shaft. The capital g is cut outsomething in the shape of a battlement, and surmounted by a hemispherical part, h, supporting a vase, C, that crows the entire monument.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

The design for a monument, composed of a base, A, made of base-steps ab, tapering part a'b', trunk d, and top e, of a column, B, having a base, $f^1f^2f^3f^4$, shaft and capital gg^1g^2 , top part h, and crowning vase C, substantially as shown and described.
