

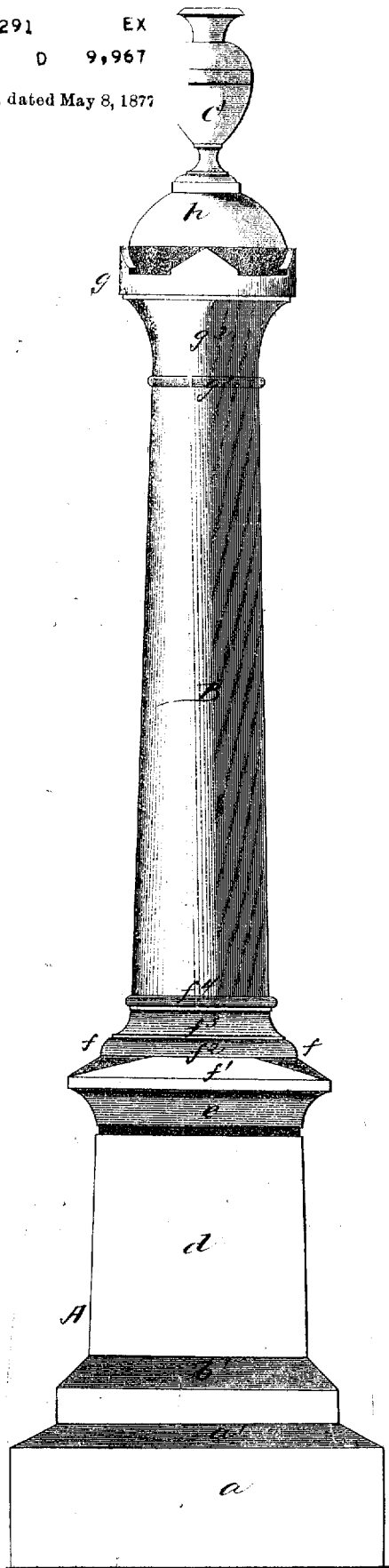

DESIGN FOR A MONUMENT.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,967**, dated May 8, 1877; application filed April 27, 1877.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES MORGAN, of Brooklyn, county of Kings, and State of New York, have invented a Design for a Monument, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully shown in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

The design refers to a monument for graves; and consists of a base, a column, and surmounting vase, as will be more fully described.

In the drawing, A represents the base of the monument, which consists of base-steps *a* and *b*, of diminishing size, with intermediate tapering parts *a'* *b'*, of a tapering middle or trunk section, *d*, with enlarged molding, and top part *e*, supporting the base of the column B. The base *f* consists of a pyramiddally-shaped base-step, *f*¹, a convex molding, *f*², a concave molding, *f*³, and a raised band, *f*⁴.

The shaft of the column rises from the base *f* with the usual degree of taper, the capital *g* extending, by a raised top band, *g*¹, and molding *g*², from the shaft. The capital *g* is cut out something in the shape of a battlement, and surmounted by a hemispherical part, *h*, supporting a vase, C, that crowns the entire monument.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

The design for a monument, composed of a base, A, made of base-steps *a* *b*, tapering part *a'* *b'*, trunk *d*, and top *e*, of a column, B, having a base, *f*¹ *f*² *f*³ *f*⁴, shaft and capital *g*¹ *g*², top part *h*, and crowning vase C, substantially as shown and described.
