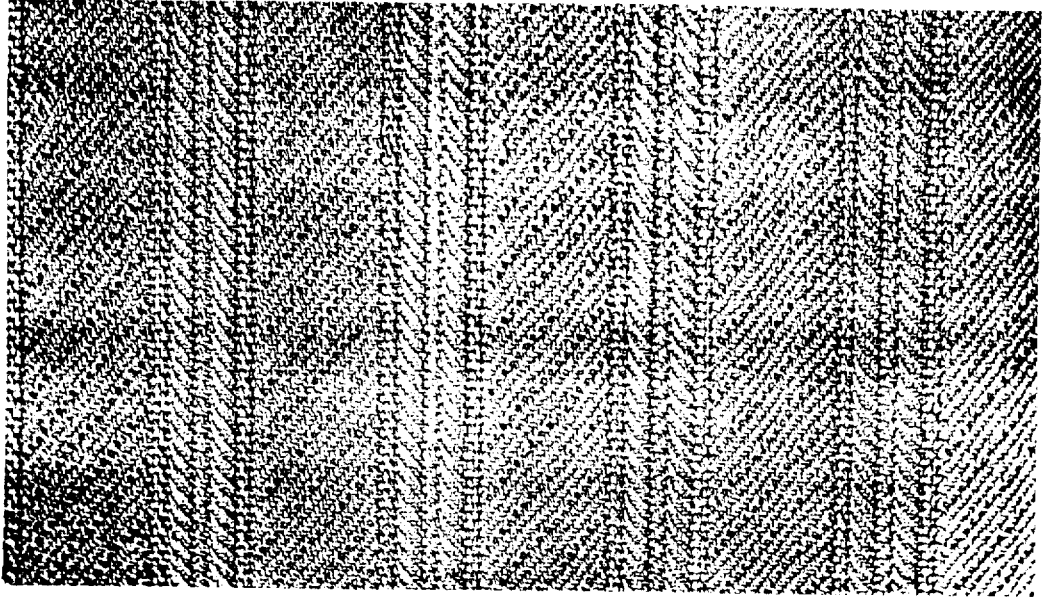

DESIGN FOR CASSIMERES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,972**, dated May 15, 1877; application filed May 2, 1877.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{4}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE C. BURNS, of Burrillville, in the county of Providence and State of Rhode Island, have invented certain new and useful Designs in Cassimeres; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable others skilled in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon, which form a part of this specification.

The following is a description of the within design:

A represents a stripe running lengthwise of the fabric, formed by a triple diagonal weave, both warp and weft, on the face. B repre-

sents, in a stripe of basket-weaving between diagonal stripes A, two bars of weaving raised to a rib or cord. C" shows, in a stripe of basket-weaving, three stripes running lengthwise of cloth, showing the woof, the whole representing a combination of the weaves A, B, and C, forming a design original and new, as shown by the accompanying photograph, which I claim as my invention.
