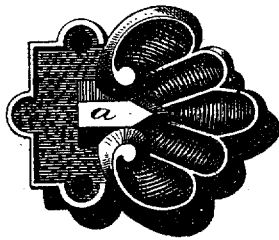

DESIGN FOR COFFIN-HANDLE EARS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,973, dated May 15, 1877; application filed May 7, 1877.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, RUSSELL H. BURR, of West Meriden, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Coffin-Handle Ears; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a front view.

This invention relates to a design for the ears or socket for coffin-handles; and it consists in the peculiar configuration as shown in the accompanying illustration.

a represents the socket proper, which rises

from the base, and forms the center of the principal ornament. This ornament is of shell form, the socket *a* located at the joint, and from each side the shell starts in scroll shape, the joint end of the shell resting on the base, all as shown in the accompanying illustration.

I claim—

The design for coffin handle socket, consisting of the socket proper *a*, resting upon a base, and forming the center of a shell-shaped ornament, as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
