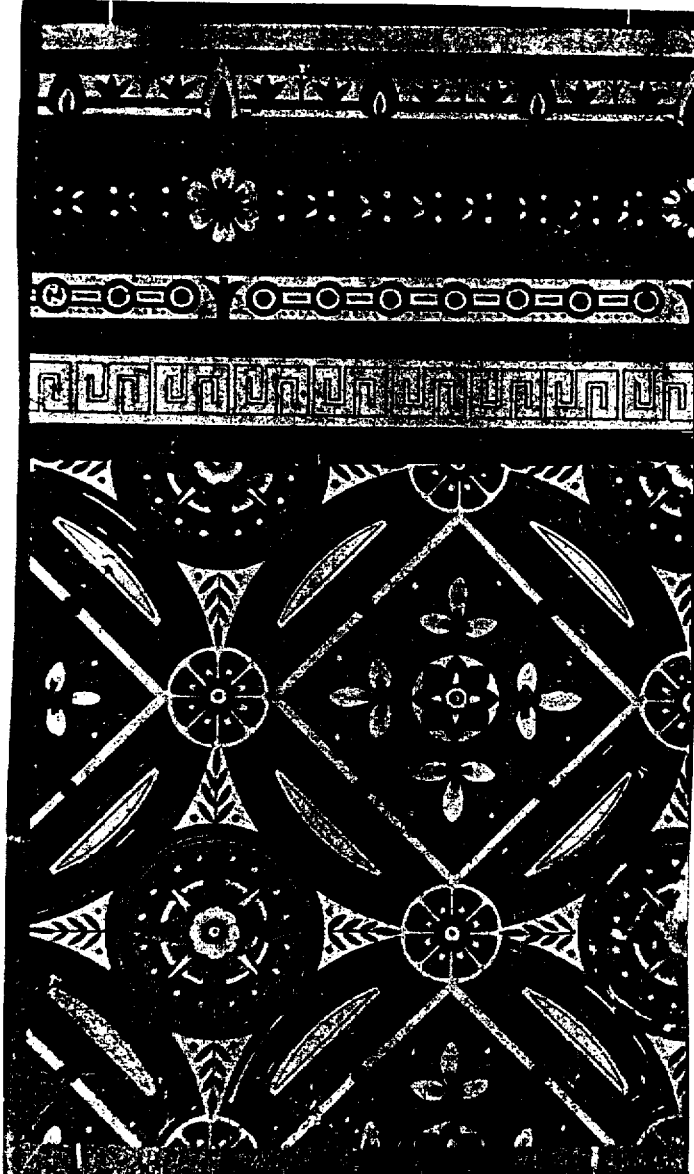

## DESIGN FOR WALL-PAPER.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,975, dated May 15, 1877; application filed March 17, 1877.  
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, CHRISTOPHER DRESSER, of London, England, have originated and designed a Pattern for Wall and other Papers, of which I hereby declare the following to be a specification:

The nature of my design is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration, which forms a part of this specification.

My design consists, substantially, of a body, A, and border B for wall-papers, composed as follows: the body of circles C C, circumscribing squares D, which contain four-leafed figures E, the spaces between the circles C being filled by smaller circles F; the bordering B of four bands—A' of wall of Troy, B of balls and link-connections, C of leaves and

flowers, and F of small geometric figures and of stripes.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States, is—

The design for a wall-paper, consisting of the body A, ornamented with circles, &c., and of a bordering, B, composed of four bands, substantially as shown and described.
