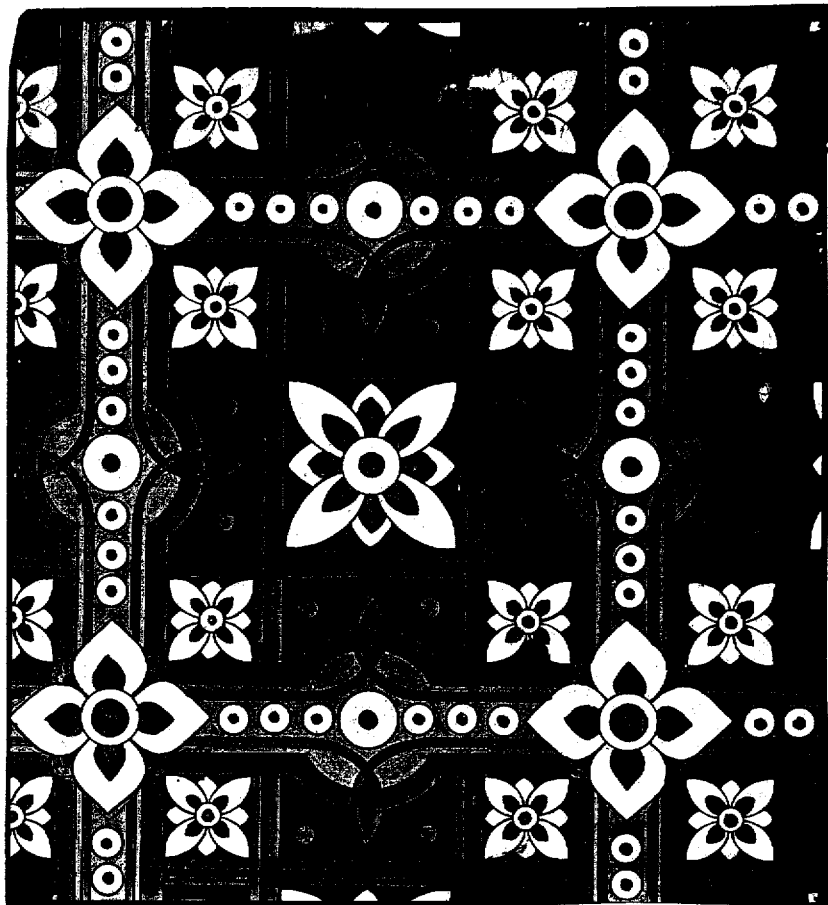

## DESIGN FOR WALL-PAPER.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,976, dated May 15, 1877; application filed March 17, 1877.  
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, CHRISTOPHER DRESSER, of London, England, have originated and designed a Pattern for Wall and other Papers, of which I hereby declare the following to be a specification:

The nature of my design is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration, which forms a part of this specification.

My design consists, substantially, of a checker-board-like ground, A, containing in squares of various sizes geometric rosettes, large ones B, and small ones C C, traversed at regular intervals by broad ornamental bands D and E, at right angles to each other.

At the intersections of the bands are placed other rosettes, F F.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States, is—

The design for a wall-paper, composed of a checker-board-like ground, A, traversed by bands D and E, at right angles to each other, substantially as shown and described.
