

DESIGN FOR WALL-PAPER.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,977, dated May 15, 1877; application filed March 17, 1877.

[Term of Patent 34 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHRISTOPHER DRES-SER, of London, England, have originated and designed a Pattern for Wall and other Papers, of which I hereby declare the following to be a specification:

The nature of my design is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration, which forms a part of this specification.

My invention consists of a design for a wall-paper body and border, the body A composed of circular figures C C, containing four trifurcated ivy-leaves, B B B, the stems of which form radii, so to speak, passing out of the circles, and joining each other in the diamond-shaped spaces D D between the circles, the bordering E, composite of scroll-work, three and four leaved flower-like figures G F, and bars of varied design.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States. is—

The design for a wall-paper, consisting of the body A, composed of circular figures C C, containing ivy-leaves B B, and of the composte bordering E, substantially as shown and described.
