## DESIGN FOR WALL-PAPER.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,982, dated May 15, 1877; application filed March 17, 1877.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHRISTOPHER DRESSER, of London, England, have originated and designed a Pattern for Wall and other Papers, of which I hereby declare the following to be a specification:

The nature of my design is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration, which forms a part of this specification.

My design consists, substantially, of a system of squares, A, containing each the figure of a Maltese cross, B, and outlined and bounded by bands C D, at right angles to each other, the bands decorated with fern stems E, and at their intersection grotesque flowers F.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States, is—

The design for a wall-paper, consisting of the squares A, containing Maltese crosses B, and the decorated bands C D, substantially as shown and described.
