DESIGN FOR WALL-PAPER.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,984, dated May 15, 1877; application filed March 17, 1877.

[Term of Patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHRISTOPHER DRESSER, of London, England, have originated and designed a Pattern for Wall or other Papers, of which I hereby declare the following to be a specification:

The nature of my design is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration, which forms a part of this specification.

My invention consists of a design for a wall-paper dedo; and is composed of a central portion of involved and elaborate scroll-work, A, in grotesque imitation of leaf-tracery, bordered by rails B B, composed of a series of circles mounted upon a longitudinal stripe, and inclosed between two narrow stripes.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States, is—

The design for a wall-paper, consisting of the central portion of grotesque leaf scrollwork A, bordered by the rails B B, substantially as shown and described.
