DESIGN FOR WALL-PAPER.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,986, dated May 15, 1877; application filed March 17, 1877.

[Term of Patent 3\frac{1}{2} years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHRISTOPHER DRES-SER, of London, England, have originated and designed a Pattern for Wall and other Papers, of which I hereby declare the following to be a specification:

The nature of my design is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration, which forms a part of this specification.

My design consists of a system of quadrilateral composite floral rosettes, A A, the larger interspaces being filled with octagonal radiated figures B, and the smaller with four-sided club-like buttons C.

What I claim as my invention, and desire !

to secure by Letters Patent of the United States, is—

The design for a wall-paper, composed of the system of floral rosettes A, interspaced with the radiated figures B and the buttons C, substantially as shown and described.
