DESIGN FOR WALL-PAPER.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,987**, dated May 15, 1877; application filed March 17, 1877.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, CHRISTOPHER DRESSER, of London, England, have originated and designed a Pattern for Wall and other Papers, of which I hereby declare the following to be a specification:

The nature of my design is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration, which forms a part of this specification.

My design consists of chains of sprays of club-ended leaves A, provided with five-leafed flowers B, both large and small, the whole so combined and arranged that each chain of spray and each flower are repeated at symmetrical intervals over the entire face.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States, is—

The design for a wall paper consisting of sprays of club-ended leaves A, with large and small flowers, substantially as shown and described.
