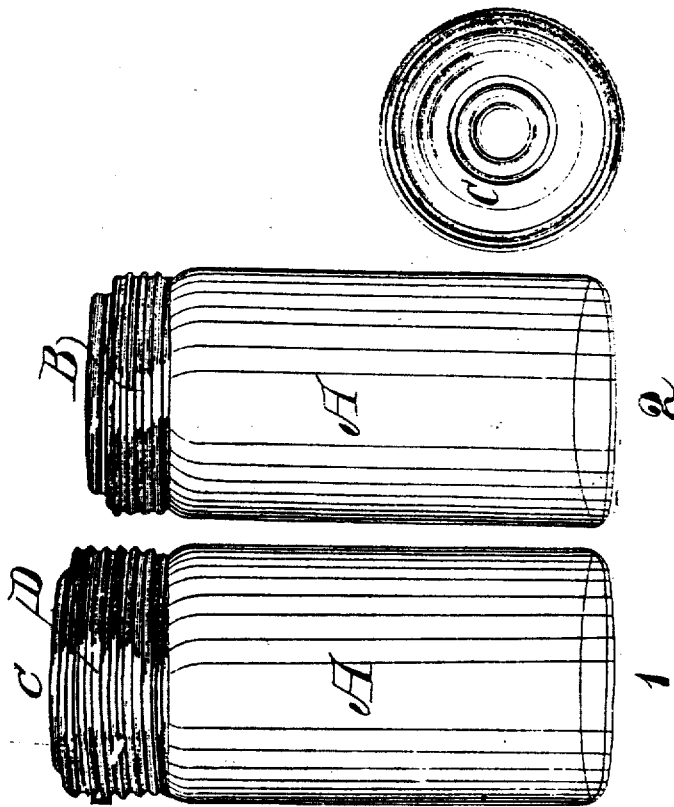

DESIGN FOR GLASS JAR.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,991, dated May 15, 1877; application filed March 22, 1877.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, STEPHEN R. PINCKNEY, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new, useful, and original Design for Glass Jars, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully set forth in the following description, and is represented in the accompanying photographic illustrations, to which reference is made.

Figure 1 is a view of the jar with its cap and threaded ring in place, and Fig. 2 is a view of the same with its cap and threaded ring removed.

In the illustrations, A represents the body of the jar from its base to its screw-threaded upper portion; B, the screw-threaded upper portion of the jar; C, the cap or cover of the jar, and D the screw-threaded ring which wholly or partially covers the screw-threaded upper portion of the jar.

The body of the jar is cylindrical in shape,

with its wall at right angles to the plane of the base or body. On the upper portion of the jar is formed in the glass wall a screw-thread, extending downward, as shown in the illustration. This screw-thread comes out substantially flush with the wall of the body of the jar, and this, in connection with the cylindrical form of the body, constitutes the distinctive feature of this design.

The body and cap or cover of the jar may be marked and ornamented with letters, figures, symbols, and designs blown in the glass, to suit the fancy or use of the maker or user.

What is hereby claimed is—

The shape of a glass jar, the body of which is cylindrical, and the neck of which is cylindrical, screw-threaded, and substantially flush with the body.
