

DESIGN FOR CLOCK AND MIRROR FRAMES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,993, dated May 22, 1877; application filed May 2, 1877. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY J. DAVIES, of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented a new Design for a Combined Clock and Mirror Frame, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

The lower portion or base of the frame consists of an arch, a. The portion b b of the frame above this arch, uniting with the crown thereof, is of the shape of a letter U, and its lower part, which receives within it the clockcase g, conforms to the circular profile of the the said case. Between the upright limbs of this U-shaped portion b b is an arch, c, which combines with the lower part of said portion to form a circular band encircling the case g. Above the crown of the arch c, and uniting therewith, is another U-shaped part, d d, which receives within it the mirror-frame c.

The upper parts of the limbs of the portions b b and d d terminate with figures of acorns. The whole frame, with the exception of the acorn figures, are of square transverse section. The arch a is ornamented with vines h h, and the arch c and space between the clock and the mirror are ornamented with vines i i, the said vines being all in high relief.

What I claim as my invention is-

1. The design and configuration of the arched base a, the U-shaped portions b b and d d, and arch c, all combined as herein described and represented.

2. In combination with the said portions a, b b, d d, and c of the frame, having the configuration described, the vines h h and i i, arranged as and having the configuration herein described and shown.
