## DESIGN FOR SHOES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 16,001, dated May 22, 1877; application filed April 28, 1877. [Term of Catent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

of Woonsocket, in the county of Providence and State of Rhode Island, have invented a new and valuable Improvement in Designs for Shoes; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the construction and operation of the same, reference being had to the annexed drawings, making a part of this specification, and to the letters and figures of reference marked thereon.

Figure 1 of the drawings is a representation of a side view of my design for shoes.

The nature of my design is fully illustrated in the accompanying photograph; and it consists in a design for gaiter-boots having buttons and a buckle, as hereinafter more fully set forth.

A represents a gaiter-boot, and B the flap thereof. C C are buttons fastened to the boot, and D is a buckle, also fastened to the gaiter at the ankle.

The flap B is made of the particular configu-Be it known that I, George W. Meader, | ration shown - that is to say, its edge is formed with a series of convex or rounded projections, a, in which are made the button. holes, and a series of concave depressions, b, between the rounded projections, and above the upper projection a the dap is extended to form the strap G, which goes in the buckle D.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is-

The design for griters shown and described, consisting of a gaiter, A, having two or more buttons, C, and buckle D, with the flap B, having curved projections a, concave depressions b, and strap G, as set forth.
