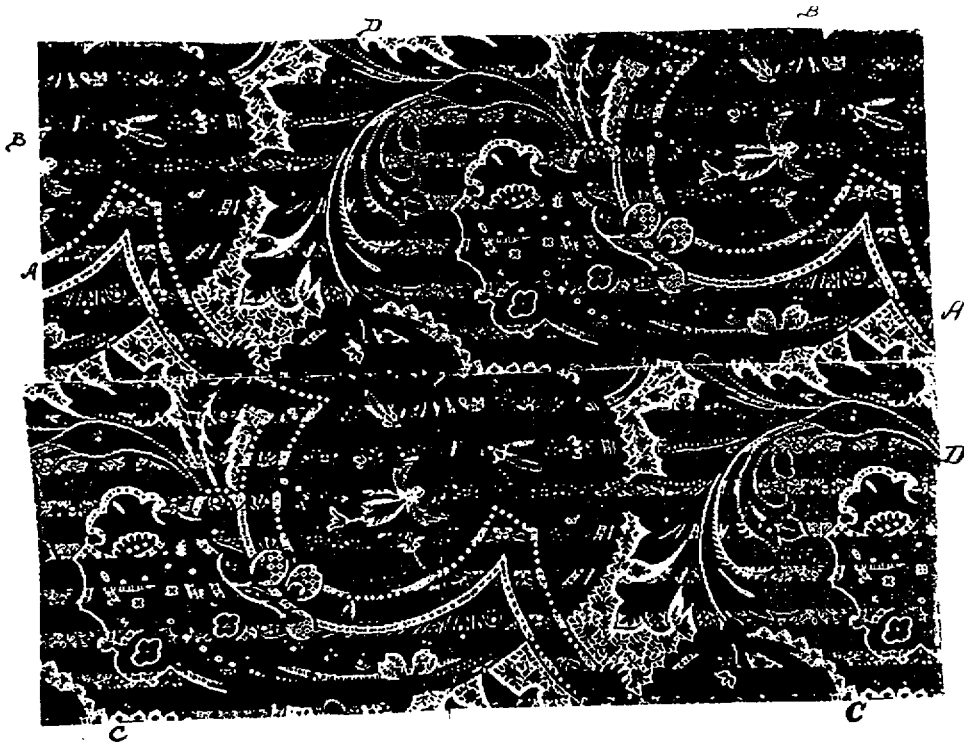

DESIGN FOR CARPET.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,002**, dated May 22, 1877 : application filed May 9, 1877.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, JOHN NEIL, of New York city, in the county and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Carpet, of which the following is a specification :

The accompanying photograph illustrates my new design.

This invention relates to a new design for a carpet, oil-cloth, or similar fabric; and consists in a new arrangement of figures, foliated ornaments, and groundwork, which make up the design.

A narrow undulated border, A, extends diagonally across the carpet and serves partly to produce a large trefoil figure, B, which

is further inclosed by a still narrower V-shaped border, C. The groundwork of this trefoil figure is ornamented with floral designs. Between the several figures B are large ornamented leaves D, of a rich oriental design. The space inclosed in the hollow of each leaf D is further decorated, partly by geometrical, partly by floral, groundwork.

I claim as my invention—

The new design for a carpet, substantially as shown.
