


## DESIGN FOR CARD-RACKS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,004, dated May 23, 1877; application filed May 7, 1877. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Peter Rosenbach, of Brooklyn, Kings county, in the State of New York, have originated a new Design for Card-Rack, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, in which—

Figure 1 is a face view; Fig. 2, a back view; and Fig. 3 is a cross-section on the line S S

in Fig. 1.

Referring to the figures, A is a piece of perforated card-board or analogous material, of a generally square form, but stepped at the edges, as indicated by a. The small squares, of which the steps or points a form two sides, are decorated as indicated by a. The central portion of the piece A may also be decorated; but this is not essential.

 $A^1$   $A^2$ , &c., are further pieces similar to the piece A, and having similar edges a a'. The several pieces A  $A^1$ , &c., are secured upon a foundation or back, B, having the sides formed with rectangular offsets, as indicated by b.

The parts A A<sup>1</sup>, &c., are partially superposed on each other, as shown.

Pendent ornaments E may be suspended from certain extreme projections at the sides, the length of these pendants E being just sufficient to cause them to swing clear, as shown. The upper and lower points may have similar pendants.

Other decorative devices may be employed at pleasure.

What I claim as my invention is-

A design for card rack, having the several pieces A  $A^1$   $A^2$ , with stepped and decorated edges a a', as shown and described.
