

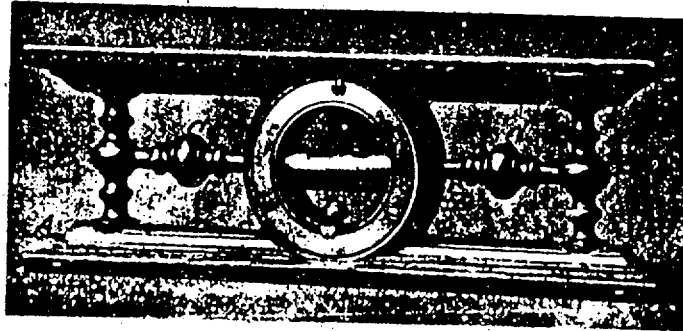

## DESIGN FOR SPIRIT-LEVELS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,014**, dated May 29, 1877; application filed May 15, 1877.  
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, LEONARD L. DAVIS, of Springfield, in the county of Hampden and State of Massachusetts, have invented a Design for a Combined Level, Plumb, and Inclino-meter, of which the following is a specification:

My invention consists of a design for a combined spirit level, plumb, and inclinometer, as hereinafter described, and as illustrated in the accompanying photograph, forming part of this specification.

This design consists of a frame composed of two plates, A A, made flat and true on their outer faces, with an ornamental molding on their inner and opposing faces, with a ring, D, at the center, connecting the two plates A, and within which is placed a movable ring, I, supporting the spirit-tube. Near their ends the plates A are connected by orna-

mental rounds B, and from each of these there extends to the central ring I a similar round, C, arranged horizontally, all as shown in the accompanying photograph, the whole forming a neat and ornamental design.

The molding on the inner faces of the plates A may be varied or omitted, if desired, and the style of the rounds B and C may also be varied, without changing, materially, the nature or character of the design.

What I claim is—

The herein-described design, consisting of the plates A A, ring D, and the rounds B and C, all arranged substantially as shown in the accompanying photograph.
