DESIGN FOR SPIRIT-LEVELS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,016, dated May 29, 1877; application filed May 15, 1877.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LEONARD L. DAVIS, of Springfield, in the county of Hampden and State of Massachusetts, have invented Design for a Spirit-Level and Plumb, of which the following is a specification:

This invention consists of a design for a combined spirit-level and plumb, as hereinafter more fully described, and as illustrated in the accompanying photograph, making part of this specification.

The design consists of two plates, AA, made flat and true on their exterior faces and edges, and having their inner and opposing faces either beveled or molded, as may be preferred, they being shown as provided with an ornamental molding. These two plates AA are connected by four ornamental cross-bars or rungs, B, and at the center is arranged, parallel with the plates AA, the spirit-tube D, which is attached to the bottom plate A by a

rest or support, I, which may be made as

shown in the photograph, or in any other style desired. Near each end a spirit-tube, C, is arranged, in line with the posts or rungs B, and at right angles to the central tube D, as shown in the photograph.

It is obvious that the particular style or form of the rungs B may be varied at will, and that their number may be more or less, according to the length of the device, without materially altering the character of the design.

What I claim is-

The herein-described design, consisting of the two plates A A, connected by the rungs B with the spirit-tubes C and D, all arranged substantially as shown in the accompanying photograph.
