DESIGN FOR SPIRIT-LEVELS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10.017, dated May 29, 1577; application filed May 15, 1877. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LEONARD L. DAVIS, of Springfield, in the county of Hampden and State of Massachusetts, have invented certain Improvements in Design for Spirit-Levels, of which the following is a specification:

This invention consists of a novel design for a spirit level, as hereinafter more specifically described, and as illustrated in the accompanying photograph, which forms a part of this specification.

The design consists of a base-plate, A, made flat and true on its bottom and edges, and having its upper face ornamented with moldings as shown or in any similar manner.

ings, as shown, or in any similar manner.

Upon this base-plate A is mounted a metal tube or case, B, which contains the glass spirit-tube ordinarily used in levels, the case B being supported on a couple of short col-

umns, C, as shown in the photograph. I also usually ornament the case B by making thereon the ornamental knobs or terminals D, though these may be varied in style or entirely omitted without materially altering the general appearance or character of my design, which consists, essentially, of the tube or case B, mounted on the base-plate A, as shown in the accompanying photograph.

What I claim is—

The herein-described design for a spiritlevel, consisting of the base-plate A, with the tube or case B and columns C, all arranged substantially as shown in the accompanying drawing.
