DESIGN FOR AN EMBROIDERY-PATTERN.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,031**, dated June 5, 1877; application filed May 18, 1877.

[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, EMIL CRISAND, of New Haven, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Embroidery-Pattern; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a face view.

This invention relates to a design for embroidery-pattern, with special reference to perforated board, the object being to indicate upon the surface of the board the stitches to be taken to produce the desired pattern.

The invention consists in the pattern shown in the accompanying illustration, and as here-

inafter described, referring especially to a motto.

The motto, which constitutes the principal characteristic of this design, is "Feed my Lambs." These words are arranged longitudinally, as shown, with a floriated tracery, forming, apparently, an ornamental bed or background on which the words rest, as shown in the accompanying illustration.

I claim—

The herein-described design for embroidery-pattern, consisting of the motto "Feed my Lambs," on a floriated ground, as shown in the accompanying illustration.
