

ROBERT FLOCKE, OF NEWARK, NEW JERSEY.

DESIGN FOR LOCK-CASES FOR SATCHELS, &c.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,033, dated June 5, 1877; application filed May 22, 1877. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ROBERT FLOCKE, of Newark, New Jersey, have originated and designed a Lock-Case for Satchels, &c., of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which ref-

erence is made.

The lock case is composed of a turret-formed center, A, having extensions B C reaching out on either side, and terminating in a hollow curve, that dies away gradually to the point where the lock case is made fast to the satchel or other frame.

The turret-formed center A is surmounted by a serrated wheel, E, and the extensions of said center, which crop out on both sides of the lock-case, are, at B, made flat and rectangular, with the upper cerners near the ends chamfered off or rounded, and the upper portions

of the parts C, near the ends, are chamfered off or rounded, making the sides and top substantially semicircular and convex, while the ends proper are also curved, but in a concave form.

The hasp D is also shaped to correspond with one of the swelling sides of the turret-formed center, so as to present the appearance, when shut into the lock-case, of being a part of the turret.

What I claim as my invention is-

A lock case having a turret-formed center swelling out from the sides of the case, surmounted by a serrated wheel, with extensions partly rectangular and partly convex, with concave ends, substantially in the manner above described.
