

DESIGN FOR CARPET.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,036, dated June 5, 1877; application filed May 26, 1877. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HUGH S. KERR, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have produced or invented a new and original Design for a Carpet-Pattern, of which the following is a specification:

The accompanying photographic illustration shows sufficient of a carpet-pattern to indicate the design, which is of a foliated character throughout, comprising bunches A and B, each composed of leaves, stems, and blossoms, and arranged in a mottled groundwork.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim— The design for a carpet fabric, substantially as described, and as shown in and by the accompanying drawing.
