

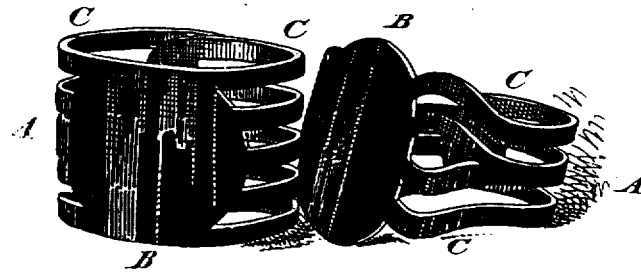

DESIGN FOR A BRACELET.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,019**, dated June 12, 1877; application filed May 4, 1877.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{4}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, CHARLES H. GRAEF, of Edgewater, in the county of Richmond and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Bracelet, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully shown in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made, and which represents in Figures 1 and 2 perspective views of different styles of my bracelet.

The invention relates to a design for a bracelet; and consists essentially of a spring band with solid center and slotted ends.

In the drawing, A, Fig. 1, represents a band of rubber, horn, tortoise, metal, or other suitable material. Fig. 2 is a modification.

The band A is provided with a solid center part, B, which may be left plain or which may

be decorated, painted, mounted with ornaments, figures, &c. The ends C of the bracelet are made of equal width with the center part, or of less width, and provided with one or more slots, longitudinal or otherwise, running up to the closed ends of the bracelet.

The slots form narrow bands of varying shape, which may be left plain or rounded off at the edges, thus forming, with the center part, an ornamental yet light bracelet.

I claim as my invention—

A design for bracelet, consisting of a solid center part, B, and the remainder of the band A, slotted from one side of said part B to the other, as shown and described.
