DESIGN FOR GROUP OF STATUARY.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,052, dated June 12, 1877; application filed May 16, 1877.

[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, John Rogers, of the city, county and State of New York, have originated and designed a Group of Statuary, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration,

to which reference is made.

The group consists of four figures, and is called the "Mock Trial." The judge is seated in the background, and is partly separated from the others by a curtain. On his left hand is the lady who takes the part of prose-

cuting attorney. She is looking at the judge and pointing with her fan to the prisoner, who is on the low seat directly in front of her, and who turns from her bitter remarks to implore the protection of the young lady policeman, who stands behind him holding him by a sash tied to his wrists.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a group of statuary representing the "Mock Trial," substantially as above described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
