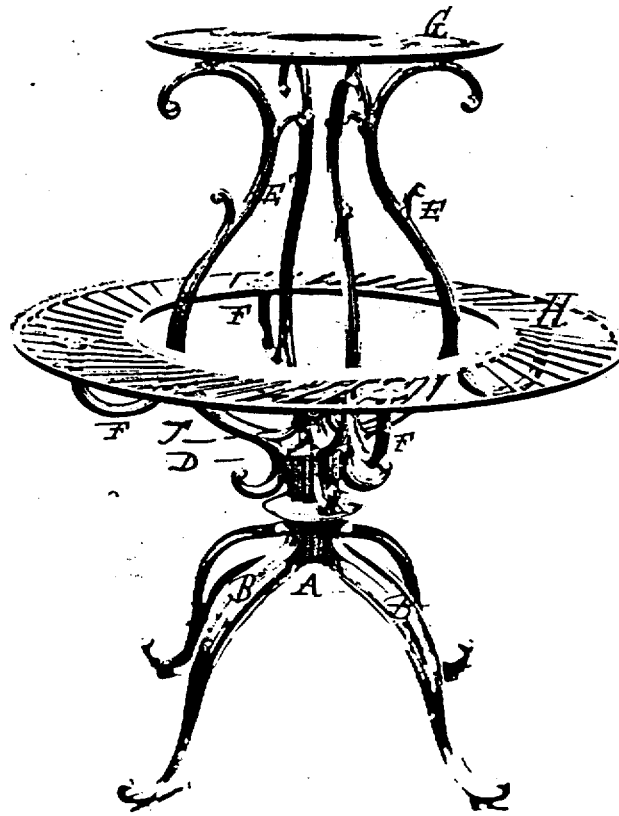

## DESIGN FOR FLOWER-STANDS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,067**, dated June 19, 1877; application filed May 28, 1877.  
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, HENRY P. ROBERTS, of Tunkhannock, in the county of Wyoming and State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a Flower-Stand, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the annexed photographic illustration, making a part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration.

A represents the base of the stand, which is supported by legs B, the upper ends of which slide in dovetail-slots in the base. Rising from this base is a spindle, over which is slipped the revolving base D, from which rises

the ogee-brackets E, provided with the pendent brackets F. Secured to the tops of the brackets E is a flanged plate, G, and a similar plate, H, is attached to the tops of the brackets F. The plates are designed to hold the pots containing plants. Rising from the base of the ogee-brackets is an ornamental standard, J, on the top plate of which may be placed a fish-globe, or any other article.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for flower-stand, substantially as shown and described.
