

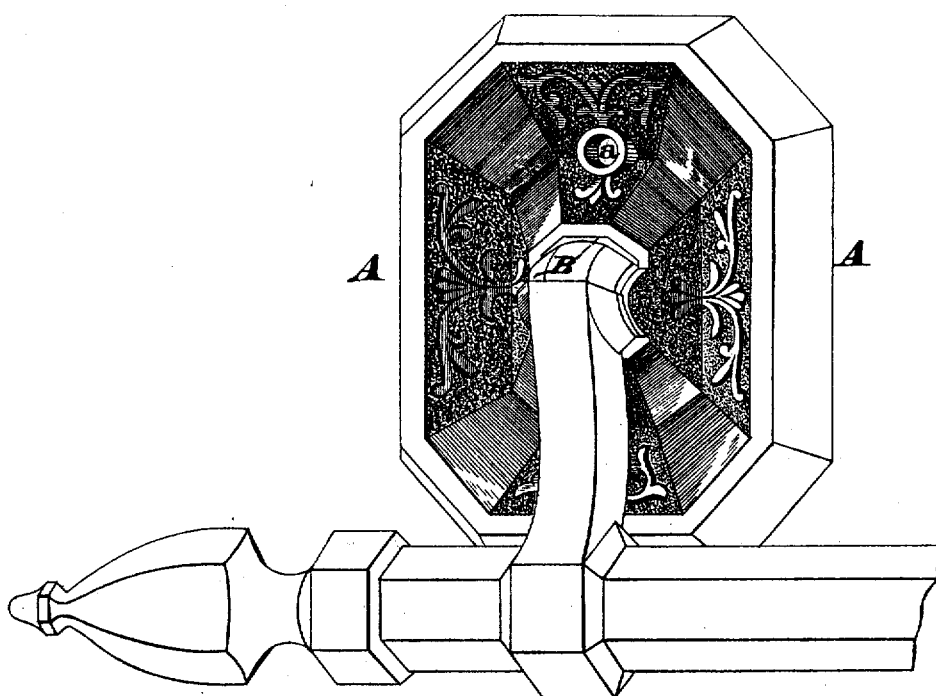

DESIGN FOR CASKET-HANDLE LUGS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,068**, dated June 26, 1877; application filed June 18, 1877.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES BARMORE, of Cincinnati, Hamilton county, State of Ohio, have invented a Design for Lug for Casket-Handles, of which the following is a specification:

Reference being had to the accompanying drawing, A represents the body of the lug, and B the cavity or opening for the reception of the handle, as shown. The lug is of eight-sided oblong shape, with straight sides and ends and diagonal corners, the entire outer edge being chamfered. The central portion is recessed by eight slopes extending inward and eight slopes extending from the center outward, the face of the recess being ornamented on alternate slopes with scrolls on roughened surface.

This design gives an elevated rim around the edge of the lug, an elevated center for the occupancy of the handle, and an annular screw-recess subject to elaborate ornamentation.

I claim—

A design for a lug or handle-socket for coffins, substantially as herein shown and described.
