



DESIGN FOR TOBACCO-BAGS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,070, dated June 26, 1877; application filed June 1, 1877.

[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM J. CUSSEN, of Richmond, in the county of Henrico, and in the State of Virginia, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Designs for Tobacco-Bags; and do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon, making a part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully illustrated by the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made, and in which—

Figure 1 is a plan view, and Fig. 2 a central section, of a tobacco-bag, showing my design.

A represents a tobacco-bag made of any suitable material, fastened at the bottom by a string, a, drawn tight, and at the top it is fastened by a string, b, in such a manner as to leave a portion, B, of the bag folded over to form a mouth.

When the bag is filled by any suitable devices it is, at the same time, flattened or pressed, so as to assume the shape as represented in the drawing, resembling two convex dishes, one inverted on top of the other, forming an edge or corner, d, around the circumference.

The usual labels and stamps are then put on and around the package in the usual manner.

Having thus fully described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for tobacco-bag, substantially as herein shown and described.
