

DESIGN FOR AN ORGAN-CASE.

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To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, SAMUEL HAYWARD, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented a Design for an Organ-Case, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying engraved illustration, making part of the same.

The engraving is a perspective view of an organ-case embodying the features of my de-

sign.

A is the rectangular body portion of the case, the ends of which have a recessed central strip which extends from bottom to top. Both the cornice a and base b are broken into this recess, as shown. The cornice is carried around on the front at the corners, where it is supported by brackets cc. The top of the case is flat, and the front above the nameboard is set back and provided with an ornamental panel of fret-work, as shown. Immediately below the brackets c c are fixed the lamp-mats d d. These are mounted upon the ornamental ends B B of the projecting keyboard portion at the highest points of the same. The top and front of the ends B B are formed by two graceful convex curves and vertical chamfered front posts. A base mold, e, extends across the front of the case, and breaks around the front edges of the ends B B with a curve. The ends B B are mounted upon highly ornamental bracket-posts C C, which have feet projecting out from the body A, and around which the base-mold b is broken, as shown.

I claim as my invention-

1. The design for an organ-case consisting of the rectangular flat-topped body A, the ends of which are recessed from top to bottom, as shown, with the moldings a b broken into the same, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying engraving.

2. The design for an organ-case consisting of the rectangular body A, the ends B B, with curved faces, as described, and the mats d d mounted thereon, all substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying engraving.

3. The design for an organ-case consisting of the body portion A, having a flat top and recessed ends, cornice a, base b, brackets c c, ends B B, and bracket-posts C C, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying engraving.
