

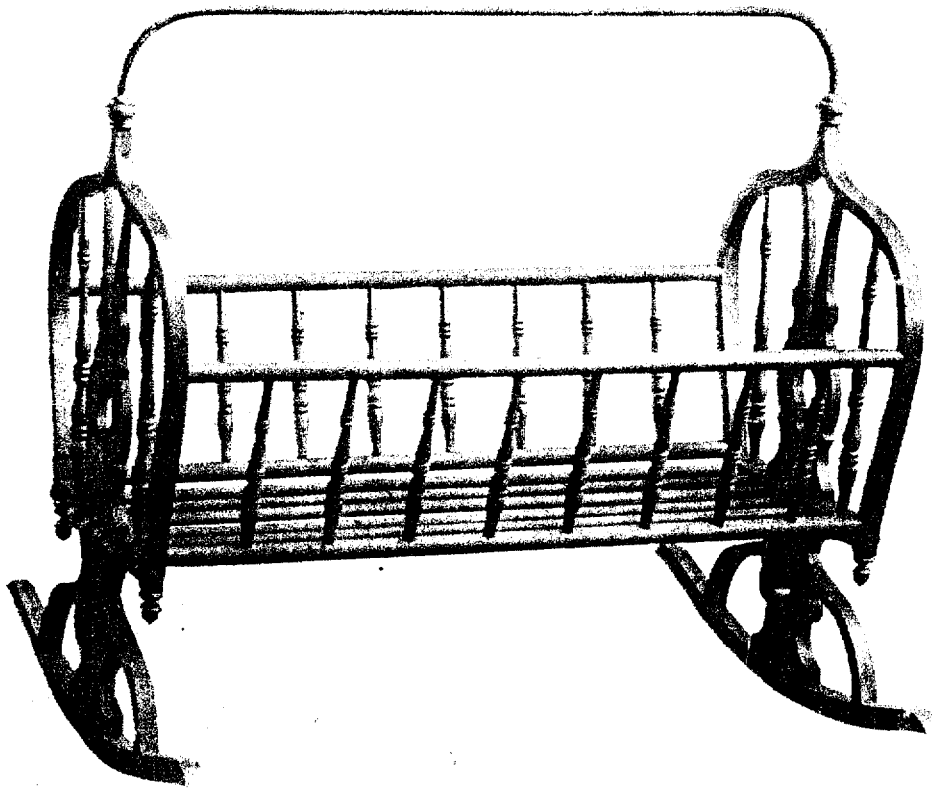

DESIGN FOR CRADLES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,075**, dated June 26, 1877; application filed April 3, 1877.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LEVI E. MINOTT, of Sheboygan, in the county of Sheboygan, in the State of Wisconsin, have originated and designed a Cradle, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying illustration, making part of this specification.

In the photographic illustration, A represents the rockers of the cradle; B, the standards attached to the rockers at the head and foot of the cradle; C C, Gothic bows at the head and foot of the cradle, and attached at the bottom to girt G, and connected at the top by bent bow D, passing into a knob, E E, on the points of the Gothic bow or arch C; F, ornamental piece passing from the cross-girt

G to the top of Gothic bow or arch C; H H H H, girts passing from Gothic arch to Gothic arch at the two ends of the cradle; I, spindles passing from girt to girt in the cradle.

The principal design of my cradle is the ornamental arches C C, bow D, and the standards B B.

What I claim as my invention is—

A design for a cradle consisting of the rockers A, standards B, Gothic bows C C, and bent strip D, running from one bow to the other, all substantially as described.
