DESIGN FOR A GROUP OF STATUARY.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,076, dated June 26, 1877; application filed June 11, 1877.

[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, John Rogers, of New York, in the county and State of New York, have originated and designed a Group of Statuary, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

I call the name of my design "School Days." The principal figure is a man with a hand-organ. In front of this stand two children, a boy and a girl. The girl is intently watching some miniature figures in the front of the hand-organ. The boy has also been looking,

but has drawn back in astonishment, and carried his right hand to his head, as a monkey on top of the hand organ has snatched his hat from his head and is holding it away from him.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a group of statuary representing school-days, substantially as above described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
