DESIGN FOR MILK-JUGS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,077**, dated June 26, 1877; application filed May 4, 1877.
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, THOMAS C. SMITH, of Green Point, Brooklyn, Kings county, New York, have invented a Design for a Milk-Jug, of which the following is a specification :

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

A represents the body of the jug, which is slightly tapered from its bottom to its top, and is made plain, or without any bulge or swell.

Around the bottom and top of the jug A are formed two beads, B, the space between them being slightly concaved. The top of the jug is slightly extended in front, as seen in the figure.

C is the handle, which is made in the form of an eagle's head, holding the head of a fish in its beak. The body of the fish is bent inward, and its tail is spread upon the lower part of the body of the jug.

The distinctive characteristics of my design are found in the plain slightly-tapering body, having two beads around its bottom and top and in the handle.

I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

1. As a new design for a mug, a body made tapering from bottom toward the top, and surrounded at bottom as well as top by a pair of raised lines, B B, as shown and described.

2. A design for a handle, consisting of an eagle's head holding the head of a fish in its beak, the body of the fish being curved inward, and its tail being spread upon the body of the vessel, substantially as herein shown and described.
