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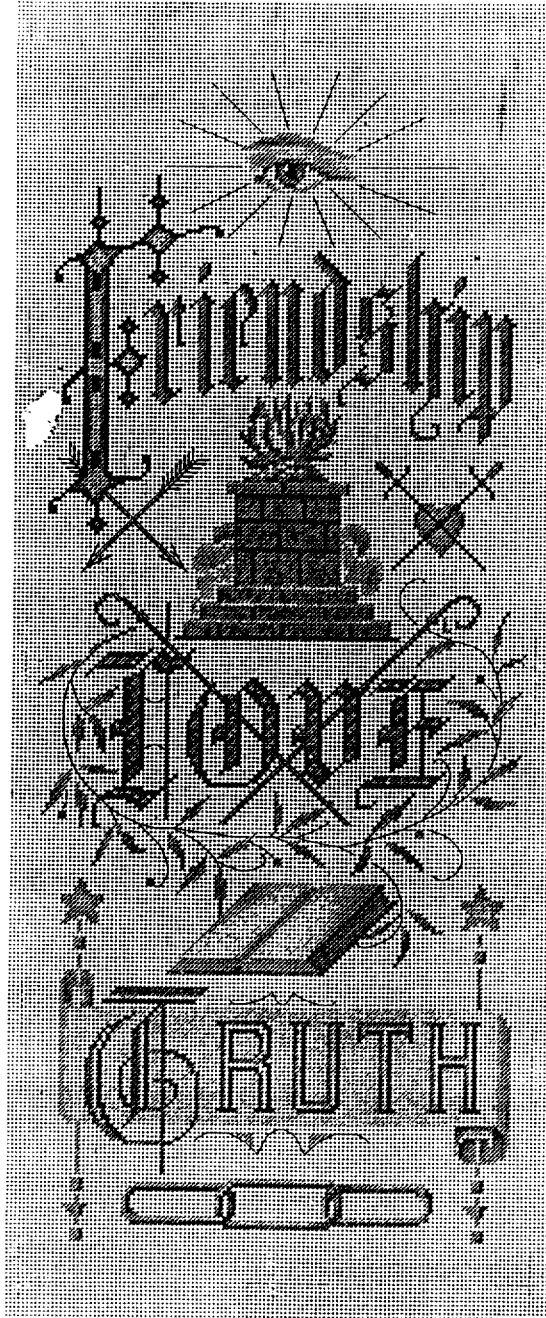

DESIGN FOR AN EMBROIDERY-PATTERN.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,083**, dated July 3, 1877; application filed June 19, 1877.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EMIL CRISAND, of New Haven, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Embroidery-Pattern; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a face view.

This invention relates to a design for embroidery-pattern, with special reference to perforated board, the object being to indicate on the surface of the board the stitches to be taken or parts to be covered to produce the pattern; and it consists in the motto "Friendship, Love, Truth," with emblems appropriate

to this motto, and as shown in the accompanying illustration.

The words "Friendship, Love, Truth," form the base of the design, and are indicated upon the surface of the board, and interspersed are the emblems, an eye, an altar, an open book, and the three links, all as shown in the accompanying illustration.

I claim—

The design for embroidery-pattern, consisting of the words "Friendship, Love, Truth," with emblems, as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
